Talk with an admissions counselor whenever you have a question.

Talk with current minority students, staff, and faculty -- Don't base your judgement on what just one person says.

Visit classes and listen and observe. -- Talk to members of minority organizations on campus.

Talk to a variety of students and not just minority students. -- Talk with minority admissions officers.

Check out the cultural and entertainment schedules. -- Stay overnight with a minority student.
