

The Bromfield School Climate Survey Results

The attached are the data from our student, parent and staff surveys. These surveys were coordinated by The Bromfield School Council and were designed to provide the administration with insights and information to consider as we work to improve our school, our practice and the educational experiences of our students.

Administered in the spring of 2009, these surveys were completed by 225 parents, 230 students, and 41 staff members. The survey results indicate our school and program have many strengths, as well as areas where adjustments could be made. While we recognize that not everyone was able to complete the survey, the insights from those who did were quite helpful and we have implemented several changes:

- The community service graduation requirement may be started junior year
- The creation of a peer mentoring program for middle and high school students
- Re-instated mentoring program for new teachers
- Increased attention to building security
- Improved communication with faculty and staff via administrative updates
- Increased opportunities for professional development and teacher input to professional development

In addition, the information and perspectives shared through the survey have also shaped and guided a variety of other decisions and discussions at Bromfield.

We appreciate the input this year's survey participants and encourage everyone to take the opportunity to offer input through next year's survey. We plan to conduct this survey annually each spring to identify trends in particular areas of response and to gather feedback on current topics such as 'half days during Thanksgiving week' and 'this year's conference schedule'.
