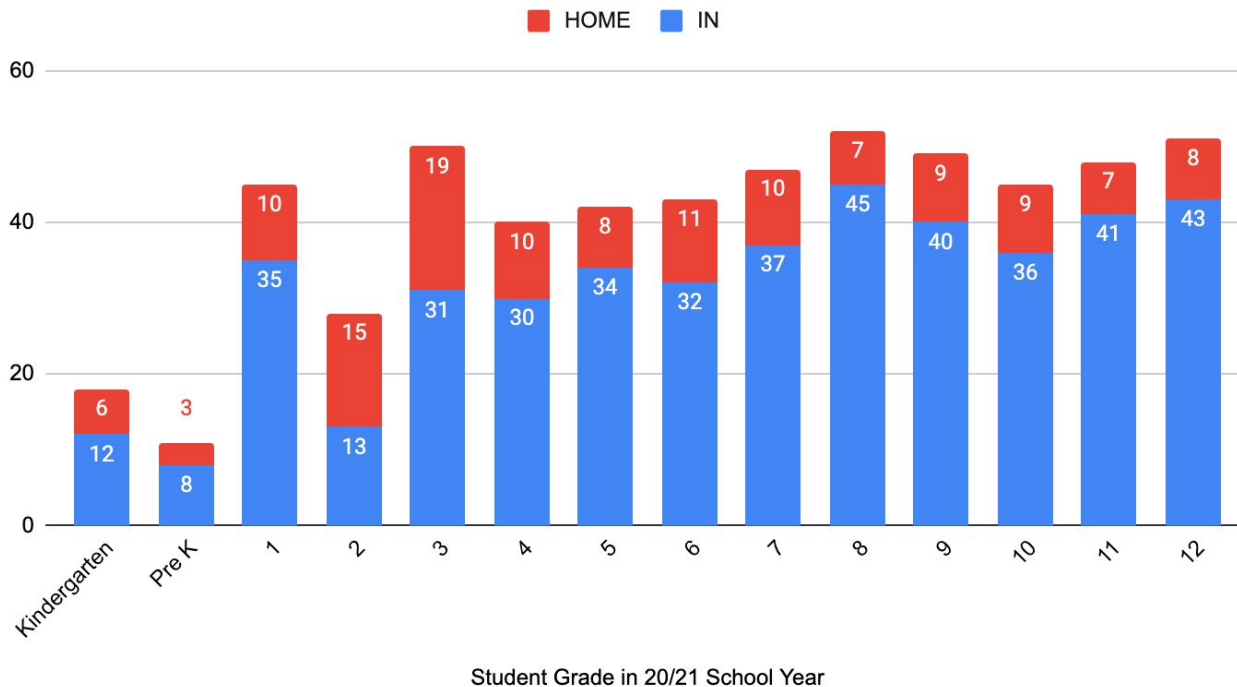


Goal/Priorities in Common

Further Details for Hybrid Phase I (Sept. 8 - Oct. 9)

IA

- ❖ 1/2 the students come in at a time
- ❖ M. Tues. - cohort and Th. Fri. cohort
- ❖ More asynchronous learning
- ❖ 6 ft distancing possible

IB

- ❖ All students in 4 days per week
- ❖ More synchronous learning
- ❖ 4.5 - 6 ft distancing

- ❖ They have 5:7 classes in school, 2:7 remote daily
- ❖ Students leave at 12:05 and transition to 2 classes at home after a lunch break (est. 1:30 - 2:20)
- ❖ Masks required for all students/teachers/staff
- ❖ Wednesday remote for cleaning

Remote Learning (family choice)

- ❖ State Offered Plan
 - Full year
 - MA aligned, but not Bromfield specific
 - Role of the district yet to be defined
 - Still under procurement
 - Grant funded and district funded; \$200
 - Remain a Bromfield student
 - Credits count though class options may be limited



Remote Learning (family choice)

❖ District Plan

- TBS - Middle School - Bromfield middle school teachers would teach four in person classes and 1 remote; all remote students would have the same schedule
- TBS - High School - Bromfield teachers would teach 4 in-person classes and 1 remote
 - Classes will be synchronous and asynchronous during the school day and some classes may be scheduled after 2:20 PM
 - On-line resources of content and curriculum in the vetting process; PD planned for curriculum alignment and collaboration
 - Virtual High School seats will be added for more options

Student Services

- ❖ Providing all of the students' services through in-school or remote
- ❖ Prioritizing their learning needs
 - Offering in-school services to families that are remote
 - Considering more in-person days for PreK students and those with intense services
- ❖ Providing fall meetings to families about their child's Individualized Education Plan



Cleaning and Overall Safety

- ❖ Director of Facilities worked with the School Nurse on cleaning compounds and materials
- ❖ Equipment and materials listed on the website
- ❖ Additional custodial support during the day
- ❖ Wednesday cleaning protocols under development
- ❖ Local Board of Health will help with on-going assessments
- ❖ DESE guidelines on our website
- ❖ Prioritizing the use of outdoor space
- ❖ Roof top units will be serviced and repaired
- ❖ Air circulation cycles will be increased



Transportation/Club,Sports

- ❖ Encouraging parent drop-off, student drivers, biking, and walking to school
- ❖ Only 26 students will fit on the bus
- ❖ We will require parents to register for bus usage, may have to run busses twice to accommodate safe travel
- ❖ Parking passes will issued if we return in Hybrid IB
- ❖ MIAA pushed the start of sports until mid-September
- ❖ Clubs will not be in-person until the earliest October 13th

Misc. Information

- ❖ Tents set up for mask breaks and outdoor classrooms
- ❖ Students waiting for HES siblings will have a designated tent location

- ❖ Technology trainings for family information on Google Classroom, Powerschool, and other technologies we are using



Community Commitment and Next Steps

- ❖ We are in this together as a community
- ❖ Supporting and explaining stricter school guidelines
- ❖ Putting aside personal/family beliefs about masks, buying a supply of them
- ❖ Limiting travel 14 days before school starts and throughout the year
- ❖ Following quarantine and isolation guidelines from DESE
- ❖ We will ask parents to indicate their initial decision about bussing and schooling by the end of this week.
