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COMMUNITY FACTS

Harvard, with approximately 5778, including Devens residents, is located 30 miles west of Boston in the northeastern corner of Worcester County, and it encompasses an area of 26 square miles. The working adults are employed in a wide range of occupations that, for the most part, consist of managerial and professional occupations. The correspondingly high level of education attainment has resulted in a community that values education and has high academic aspirations for its children.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

The Bromfield School is a comprehensive public high school and is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. It has an enrollment of 659 students, grade 6-12. The Senior class enrollment is 106. There are 57 teachers providing a 12:2 student/faculty ration.

CURRICULUM

An interdisciplinary academic program is prepared for each pupil in grades 9-12. High school students may elect up to 7 courses each year from 100 different offerings. Twenty-two credits are required for graduation from The Bromfield School. Fourteen particular courses are included in the core distribution requirements:

- 4 English credits
- 3 Social Studies credits including U.S. History
- 2 Science credits including Biology
- 2 Mathematics credits
- 2 Health/Physical Education/Wellness credits, one of which must be in PE and one in Wellness
- 1 Art credit

Academic courses are offered at Advance Placement, Honors, and College Preparatory levels. A Community Service Project of 40 hours is required for graduation. Many students begin their high school math and world language sequence in Middle School, a ninth grade transcript that has H Algebra II, Geometry and/or French or Spanish II on it indicates that the student has taken the pre-requisite course(s).

The Bromfield School's Class of 2018 ranked at or near the top of all schools in Massachusetts in the 2016 published 10th grade MCAS rankings. Our scores follow: English Language Arts: 79% Advanced, 21% Proficient, Mathematics: 84% Advanced, 12% Proficient, 4% Needs Improvement.

GPA/CLASS RANK

Because of its size, its academic intensity, and its college preparatory orientation **The Bromfield School does not weight nor rank its students.** Classes outside of The Bromfield School are not calculated in The Bromfield School GPA. Ninety percent of the Class of 2017 attended a four-year college and two percent attended a two year college.

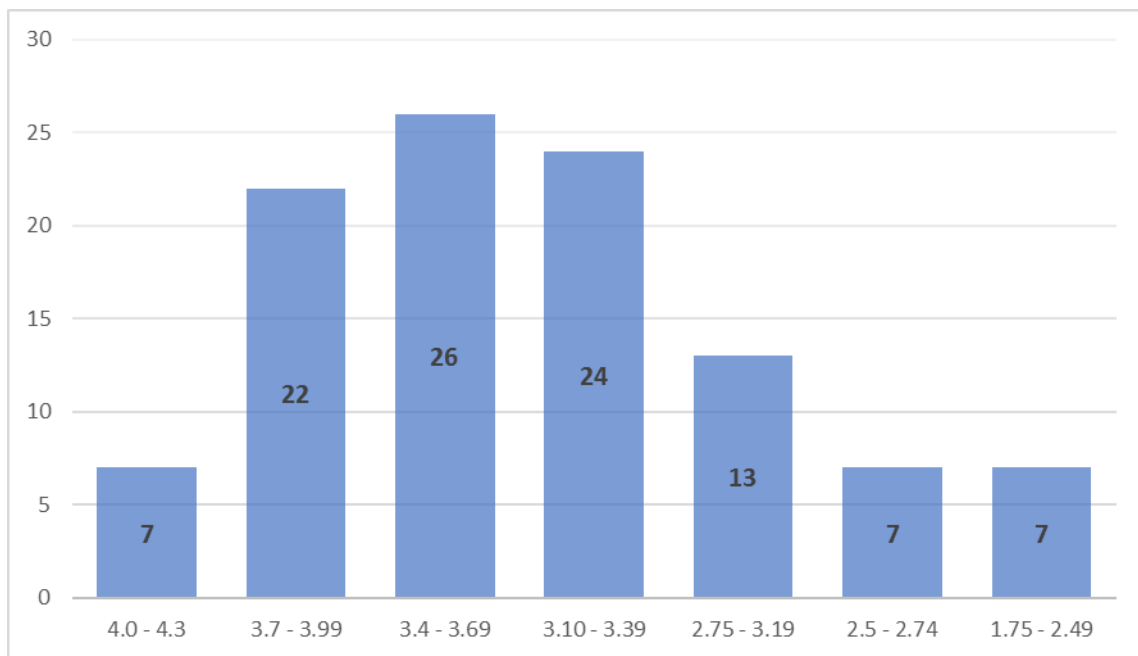
GPA Profile of Class of 2018
