Dear Parents of students in _____,

This letter is to inform you that a student in your child's classroom has a severe peanut/nut and egg allergy. Strict avoidance of peanut/nut and egg products is the only way to prevent a life threatening allergic reaction. We are asking your assistance in providing the student with a safe learning environment.

If exposed to these products the student may develop a life-threatening allergic reaction that requires emergency medical treatment. The greatest potential for exposure at school is to peanut and egg products. To reduce the risk of exposure, the classroom will be peanut/nut/egg free. Please avoid nut and egg products i.e. peanut butter or egg salad sandwiches for snack. If baking special foods for the classroom avoid nuts. An alternative snack will be provided for the student with the egg allergy. Any exposure to these products through contact or ingestion can cause a severe reaction. If your child has eaten peanuts/nuts/eggs prior to coming to school, please be sure your child's hands have been thoroughly washed prior to entering school. Your child **will** be able to eat these foods in the cafeteria.
